	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Easily accessible and youth friendly info about opportunities • Mechanisms of communication to adapt the jobs to the young people needs • Transparency and real dialogue with authorities, not only consultation, but evaluation also (National working groups are not consulted and in a theoretical way it should be a continuously dialogue.
